Last month Paul Koleske was here at Good Shepherd Parish to conduct our Parish Mission Renewal. While Paul was here I took him on a tour of Pittsburgh showing him Mt. Washington, PNC Park and Heinz Field, Downtown, and Oakland. We visited St. Paul Cathedral, stopped at Starbucks on Craig Street in Oakland, and visited the University of Pittsburgh Campus. While giving him a tour of our city we ran into a person that I know who considered themselves a "fallen away Catholic." They were born and raised Catholic but over the years fell away from the faith. They tried various traditional Protestant and Non-Denomination Churches. They were "church shopping" trying to find a perfect fit. Over the years this person never felt "spiritually fed." They were learning about the bible and the importance of scripture, but they missed the Eucharist. After hearing Paul Koleske give his powerful conversion story I invited this person to visit Good Shepherd Parish. This person has now "returned home" to the Catholic Church and is attending Mass at Good Shepherd on a weekly basis!

This Sunday, is the Fourth Sunday of Lent, also known as Laetare Sunday, or "Rejoice Sunday." The readings focus on love and forgiveness. In the Gospel, when the younger boy returns home broken, vulnerable, and seeking help, the father forgives. The prodigal son is welcomed back, not because of what he has done or not done, but because of who he is; a valued member of the family. This gospel is an everlasting reminder that God is always there we admit our faults and we come home to God's loving embrace. The church is a reconciling community. Let us Let Go, and Let God.
